What once began as one man at the University of West Florida overseeing two centers in Northwest Florida, has grown to a vibrant statewide partnership of more than 40 centers and over 250 employees providing tools, training, and expertise to thousands of Florida's small businesses each year.

The network continues to work with small businesses to help them pivot and adjust business strategies to navigate the new normal.

Hosted by Indian River State College the Florida SBDC at IRSC provides aspiring and existing small businesses in Indian River, St. Lucie, Martin and Okeechobee counties with no-cost consulting, low-cost training, and access to business data and research resources.

Last year locally the Florida SBDC at Indian River State College, provided over 6,070 consulting hours to more than 700 small businesses, resulting in approximately \$14 million in capital access for our area.

Regional Director Tom Kindred states, “With the growth of manufacturing along the Treasure Coast and the impact this industry sector will have on our market place the SBDC at IRSC believed it was important to add a manufacturing specialist to support and complement our other business assistance offerings.”
